Middle School Island Project


Maine has many ocean islands, which means that a good number of Maine residents live a life that is different from those who live on the mainland. Twelve middle school students have undertaken a project to study a Maine island that is not connected by a bridge or causeway. The students are doing research on their own at home and meeting as a group to share information and continue their investigations once a month. They are getting information together to share in a conference for their



families and the rest of the middle school in June. All of the islands have a smaller number of year-round residents with a boost in population in the summer. Some students have pen pals (email pals), others are interviewing island residents, and some are reading books written about their island. The overall purpose is to understand the benefits and potential difficulties of island life.
