YICK TAKE HOME FACTS

Tick identification: What do ticks look like?





Deer Tick

- Dark scutum (dot/shield behind the head)
- More common in spring/fall
- Carries Lyme disease

Dog Tick

- White scutum (looks like racing stripes)
- More common in summer

Habitat and Travel: Where do ticks live? How do they travel?

- Prefer leafy, tree or bush covered areas
- Ticks dislike sunny, dry places because they can dry out, so open and dry habitats will reduce the number of ticks
- Ticks cannot jump or fly; ticks grab onto people, clothing, and fur as they walk by and then crawl until they find a feeding area on the skin

Diseases carried by ticks: Can ticks carry diseases?

Yes, ticks carry diseases. The most common tick-borne diseases in Maine are:

- Lyme disease
 - o Most common in Maine
- Anaplasmosis
 - o 2nd most common in Maine
- Babesiosis
 - o Emerging in Maine

Symptoms of Lyme disease: How will I know if I have Lyme disease?

Not all people exhibit these symptoms. If you do experience these symptoms, see a medical provider.


- Erythema migrans ("bull's-eye" rash)
- Muscle and joint pain
- Fatigue
- Chills, fever, and headache
- Swollen lymph nodes

Tick Removal: What if I find a tick on me?

- Scoop off using tick spoon or use tweezers to grasp tick as close to skin as possible and pull gently without twisting
- Put tick in a sealed container of rubbing alcohol to kill it and preserve it in case it needs to be tested

Annual Plant Sale at Camden Hills Regional High School



Last year our regular plant sale did not take place, but we were able to get plants to lots of people and donated lots of money to great organizations that are working to build a strong food system. This year we are back to our somewhat normal plant sale. We have had a small but awesome crew of students hard at work to have as many different types of plants available for sale.

The Horticulture & Gardening class's annual sale will take place Saturday, May 15 and Sunday, May 16 at the greenhouse

on campus. The sale always takes place the weekend after Mother's Day. The greenhouse is located in back near the loading dock area of the school. Please be aware that we will be limiting the number of people in the greenhouse and masks will be required so you may want to factor in a little extra time for your visit.

We will have lots of vegetable and herb seedlings as well as a wide variety of annuals and perennials. All plants are grown using organic practices and do really well once planted. There are always new varieties, including heirlooms. In addition to plants, we hope to have bags of compost for sale. We are currently assessing whether it is ready for distribution. Each bag is about 40lbs, is high quality, organic compost and sell for \$6 each.

Sale takes place Saturday, May 15 from 8am - 1 pm and on Sunday, May 16 from 9am - noon. All containers are \$3 each. Buy 3 and get a 4^{th} for free. On Sunday everything is buy one, get one free from 9-11 and the last hour everything is \$1.

The Child Care Subsidy Program (CCSP) helps eligible families to pay for child care so they can work, go to school or participate in a job training program.

Who is eligible to receive Child Care Subsidy?

Eligible families must meet the income guidelines (Word) And

At least one of the following activities:

- □ Work
- School
- Job Training Program

Who can I choose as my child care provider?

- Licensed child care centers
- Licensed family child care homes
- Adults who provide care in their own homes
- Adults who come to your home to provide care
- Relatives over the age of 18
