Monthly Substance Use Prevention Update: Keep your children safe and healthy – Be aware of prescription stimulant abuse

The arrival of the holiday season means end of semester exams are coming up fast! Did you know that almost 10% of high school seniors admit to abusing ADHD medications in the past year, according to the National Institute on Drug Abuse? At school, teens may be tempted to misuse prescription stimulants to stay up late to do last minute studying, lose weight or feel a high. Stimulants may seem like a quick solution to last minute studying, but students who abuse prescription stimulants actually had *lower* GPAs than those who didn't, according to the NIH.

Prescription stimulants, also known as Amphetamines (Eg. Adderall and Dexedrine) and Methylphenidate (Eg. Ritalin and Concerta), might be prescribed for:

- Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- Narcolepsy
- Depression

If you or your family member has medication at home, be aware of where your medication is stored and keep an eye out for sudden changes in supply. If you notice medication missing or that your child has a sudden unexplained increase in cash flow, talk to them about it.

Even a teen who is prescribed stimulants can misuse them by taking them differently than medically directed. This can look like taking too many, crushing and snorting, or injecting. These forms of administering stimulants can cause severe damage to the heart, brain and other organs because inactive ingredients in the tablets can block small blood vessels.

Abuse of these prescriptions can cause increased blood pressure, irregular heartbeat, and risk for seizures and stroke. Red flags for prescription stimulant abuse include:

- Insomnia
- Excessive weight loss
- Twitching
- Memory problems

Keep lines of communication open and talk about the dangers of prescription stimulant abuse. If you notice or suspect signs of a drug problem in your teen, take action right away. Consult their primary care provider or school guidance counselor.
