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## **Busline Basketball**



We are excited to announce that Busline League Basketball is now open for registration. The teams are currently open to students in 6th, 7th and 8th grades. Players must have a current physical form on file (no older than two years) to participate in practices and games. The physical form can be found here. Parents must register through this Google Form.

The season will not start until after Thanskgiving with our first game scheduled for December 5th and the last game of the regular season on January 21st. This is generally a five day a week program, Monday-Friday with two games per week. Games usually start at 3:45 PM. Girls will play first in 2022 and boys will play first in 2023. Students will take a bus to and from away games and will be brought back to HES. A final schedule will be coming soon.

Many of our communities are experiencing a surge of cases of hospitalizations and Emergency Department visits of children with Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV).

RSV is a common respiratory virus that causes mild, cold-like symptoms but can be serious in infants and older adults, causing bronchiolitis (inflammation of the small airways) and pneumonia. RSV is contagious and is spread through contact with droplets from the nose and throat of infected people when they cough or sneeze. It can remain on surfaces for several hours and skin for shorter amounts of time.

Symptoms include:

- Runny nose
- Decreased appetite
- Coughing
- Sneezing
- Wheezing
- Fever
- Some kids with RSV can develop a bacterial infection, such as an ear infection.

Please call your physician if your child develops increased effort in breathing, dehydration, decreased level of alertness, blue or grey coloring of the lips, tongue or skin.

Comforting measures for kids with RSV include nasal saline with gentle suctioning for easier breathing and feeding. Use a cold mist humidifier to break up mucus and ease breathing effort. Keep your child hydrated and treat the fever as prescribed by their physician.

As always, good and frequent hand hygiene helps prevent the spread of germs.



- 5. You will receive an email confirmation when your child's enrollment is confirmed.
- 6. Payments will be electronically drafted the Friday before each week of care.
