Our visitors taught us how to spin wool, make felted balls and finger-knit. This was a wonderful way to end our unit and practice being kind and respectful to visitors at our school.





Hello HES Community,

Norovirus, stomach flu, tummy bug. Whatever you call it, there has been a nationwide spike in this highly contagious virus since February. Signs and symptoms to look for are nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, stomach cramps, fatigue, low grade fever, and body aches.

Unfortunately some of you have experienced this already but if it does happen in your home there is no specific treatment and it typically resolves in a few days. Some management strategies include the following:

- 1. Replace the fluids that were lost. Oral rehydration beverages for the younger kids, broth and sports drinks for the older kids. Avoid high sugar drinks such as soda and juice as this can worsen diarrhea.
- 2. Ease back into eating with bland foods.
- 3. Get plenty of rest.
- 4. <u>Seek medical attention if diarrhea does not go away for several days or if you experience severe stomach pain, dehydration, bloody stools or vomiting.</u>

How do you prevent the spread?

- 1. Stay home if you are sick.
- 2. Handwashing is your superpower! Wash your hands with soap and water, alcohol based hand sanitizer is not as effective as soap and water.
- 3. Avoid handling food or drinks that were prepared by someone who was sick, or if you have been sick.
- 4. Disinfect surfaces using a bleach solution.
- 5. Avoid traveling for two to three days after symptoms are gone.
