Maine's New Through Year Assessment

In the 2019-2020 school year, as our community worked to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, the Maine Department of Education (DOE) recognized the need to provide families, students, teachers, and education leaders with timely and useful information to support student learning. To meet this goal, the Department formed a partnership with NWEA, the creator of MAP Growth assessments.

With many teachers across Maine already using NWEA's MAP Growth assessments to measure student growth, the Maine DOE has worked with NWEA to develop a new, innovative statewide assessment, the Maine Through Year Assessment in Reading and Mathematics. The Maine Through Year Assessment continues to provide scores as a measure of student growth throughout the year and, at the end of the year, provides performance scores based on the state standards.

Students in grades 3-8 and second year of high school will participate in the Maine Through Year Assessment. The first administration of the Maine Through Year Assessment will be in May 2023, and then beginning in the fall of 2023 students will take the Maine Through Year Assessment in the fall, winter (optional), and spring. For those multilingual learners with a U.S. school entry date on or after February 4, 2022, the spring 2023 Reading assessment is optional.

Key Features of the Maine Through Year Assessment

- The assessment is **computer adaptive**. After a correct answer, a student may see a more difficult question. After an incorrect answer, a student may see an easier question. As a result, the assessment adapts to the learner and is unique to every student.
- The assessment is designed to be **untimed**. Students should be provided as much time as they need to answer all assessment questions. For the average student, the assessment will take about 60 minutes for each subject (Reading and Math).
- The assessment provides the opportunity for teachers to access and use **immediate**, actionable data to plan instruction. Starting in fall 2023, teachers will receive assessment data within 24 to 48 hours.
- The fall, winter, and spring assessments can be used as one way to measure student growth over time. The spring assessment can be used as one way to measure student performance according to grade-level state standards. To create a more complete understanding of what your student knows and can do, results from the Maine Through Year Assessment should be used alongside additional sources, such as school assessments and classroom learning.
- A variety of student supports and accessibility features are available to students to ensure that the assessment experience is as consistent as possible with the student's daily instruction. These accessibility features include, but are not limited to, supports and accommodations for students with support plans, Individual Language Acquisition Plans, 504 Plans, and IEPs.

The administration window for state assessments, such as the Maine Through Year Assessment, may bring temporary changes to a student's schedule or routine. Families are encouraged to reach out to their school with questions and concerns, ensuring that there is understanding and collaboration around creating a positive assessment experience for every student.

Camden Hills Regional High School's Annual Plant Sale and NEW Marketplace

Spring is here! Lots of beautiful plants, compost and a variety of other items will be available for sale.

We have vegetable and herb seedlings, as well as a variety of annuals and perennials. Plants are thriving this year and look wonderful. We have some new varieties and of course lots of the most popular varieties from the past. All plant containers are \$3 each and include single pots, 2-pks, 3-pks, and 4-pks. Buy 3 and get a 4th for free. On Sunday everything is buy one, get one free from 9-11 and the last hour everything is \$1.

In addition to plants we have bags of compost for sale. Each bag is about 40lbs, is high quality, organic compost and sells for \$10 each. This has been a very popular item so this year we are limiting it to 5 bags of compost per household.

New this year, we will have a Marketplace that includes a series of *Radical Reuse* products students created in our school's design+build hub, the Hatchery Workshop.

Items for sale include outdoor furniture, upcycled bicycles, planters, silkscreen T-shirts, and more – each made with reclaimed materials and careful handiwork. Support youth artistry, craftsmanship, and waste diversion all at once! Prices range from \$10 - \$200.

Sale takes place Saturday, May 20 from 8am - 1 pm and on Sunday, May 21 from 9am - noon at the greenhouse and parking lot area near the greenhouse on campus. The sale always takes place the weekend after Mother's Day. To find the sale area go to the back of CHRHS near the loading dock area of the school and look for the greenhouse.
